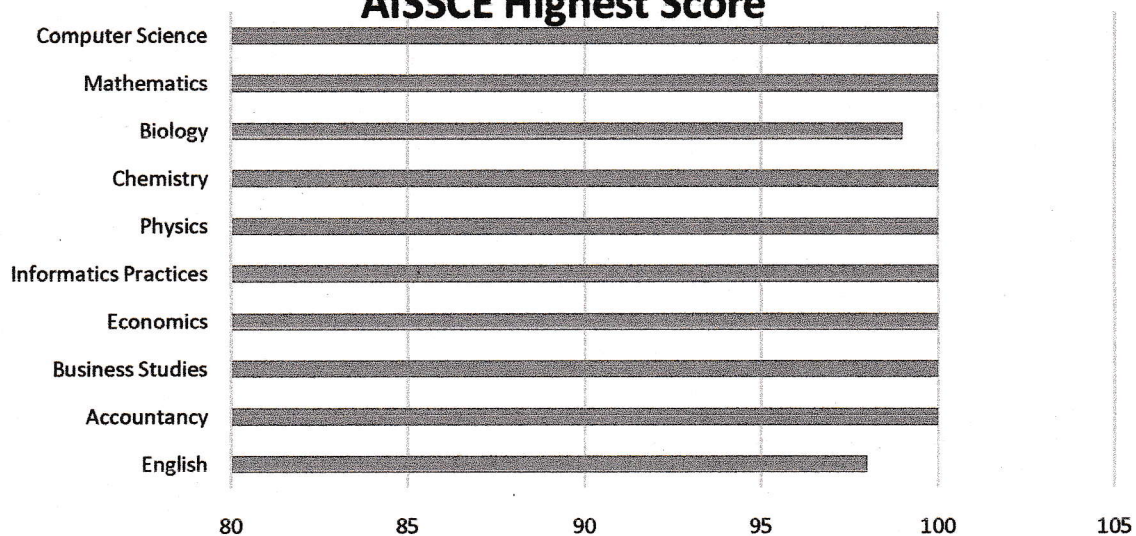

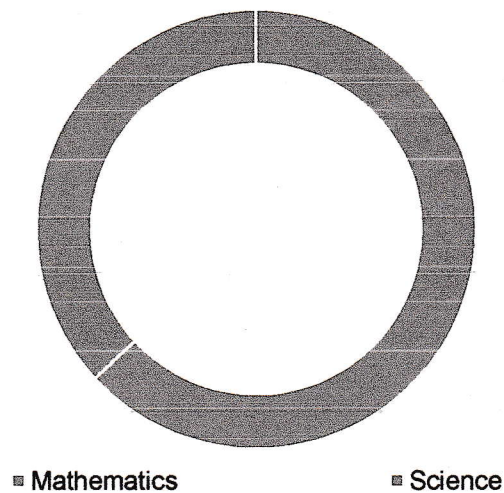

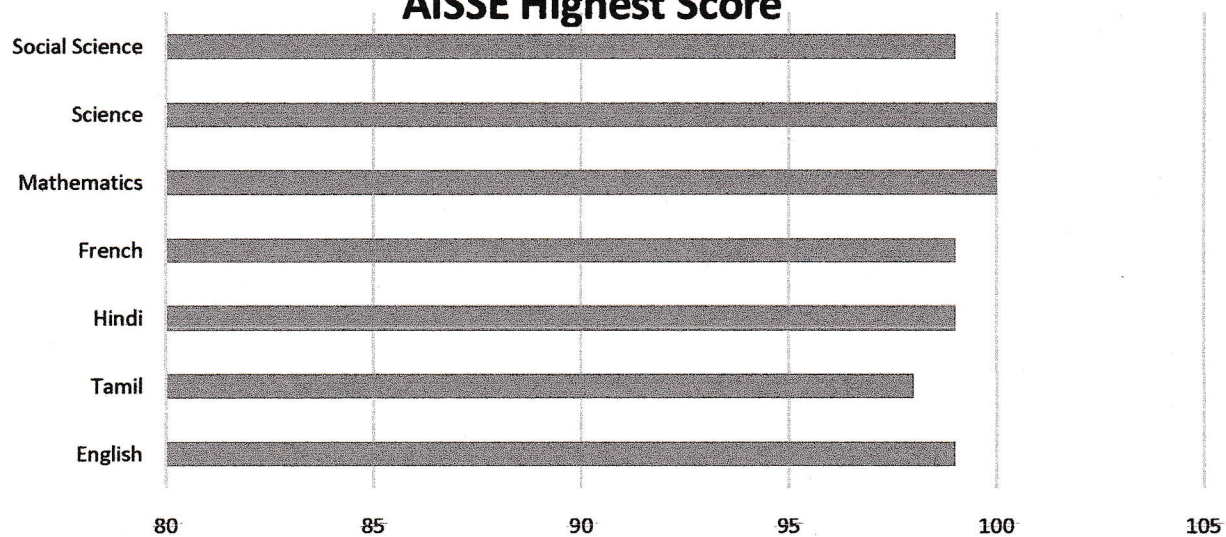

MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

1. School Management Committee (SMC)

- a. The SMC meets annually prior to the commencement of the academic session to undertake executive discussions.
- b. The following decisions were passed by convening the SMC:
 - i. Extension of CBSE Affiliation.
 - ii. Utility of different digital platforms for online classes.
 - iii. Training sessions on conducting online classes for staff members.
 - iv. Commencement of online classes under protocols from the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and the Government of Tamil Nadu.
 - v. Recruitment and changes in the staff for the following academic year.
 - vi. Completion of NISHTHA courses by the faculty.

2. Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

- a. The PTA meets bi-annually, at the start and midway through the academic year to discuss and review ongoing decisions and work towards the collective betterment of the school community.
- b. The following reviews were conducted by convening the PTA:
 - i. Review of online classes as per Government directives.
 - ii. Conduct of online tests and evaluate their impact on students.
 - iii. Deliberate on non-payment of fees and suitable action under orders of the Hon' Court of Madras.
 - iv. Execution of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) prescribed by the Hon' Central and State Governments for partial reopening of the school campus.
 - v. Review and deliberation of suggestions put forward by the members of the PTA representing the broad parent and student communities.
